

Plan ahead to make the most of your day



The \$38 billion transformation of Victoria's transport system is picking up pace. Major transport upgrades are planned on parts of our rail and road networks which may impact your journeys, especially during school holidays.

Not everyone can work flexibly, but you may need to change your usual travel and work practices for a more comfortable or quicker journey if your usual trip is disrupted during the major transport upgrades.

Plan ahead... to avoid long delays

Planned rail and road disruptions may add more time to your journeys and impact your travel experience. Some options worth considering include:

- Arrive into the city by 7.30am to avoid long delays.
- Touch off on public transport by 7am for free travel.
- Work remotely for the first couple of hours of the day.
- Work from home or from another office or location outside the city one day a week.
- Go to ptv.vic.gov.au to plan your journey and for updates on planned disruptions.
- Go to vicroads.vic.gov.au for changes and updates on the road network and travel times.

And if you do travel during the peak, or on a bus-replacement service, please allow extra time.

Plan ahead... to work more flexibly

- Speak to your manager about the changes you would like to make to your work arrangements during school holiday transport disruptions.
- If you are part of a team, agree when and where each of you will be working and coordinate to ensure services are provided to clients and stakeholders.

Plan ahead... try another travel option

- If you live close to the city, consider walking or cycling to work once or twice a week to build more activity into your commute.
- Use online maps or journey planning apps to plan your best route and travel time.
- Talk to colleagues, they may have suggestions and tips about walking and riding to work.
- Check out the end-of-trip facilities (secure bike parking, showers and lockers) in or near your office.
